SUGGESTED TOPICS

Public health and populism

Medical emergencies are staple features of today's culture of breaking news. As politics becomes increasingly stylized, audiences fragmented, and established knowledge claims contested, health crises have become even more vulnerable to politicisation.

Public health as balance of responsibilities

Not only the rights of patients are important but there are also responsibilities to be taken under account: "You have the right to be infectious as long as you do not infect anyone else".

Vulnerable groups, minorities, and migrants health

Challenges to public health in case of migration and minorities' (including sexual minorities) mental health and their experiences of stigma and minority stress across setting.

Digital health information data protection and surveillance

How are digital solutions contributing to enhance immunization programs and other policies?

Universal Health Coverage - future

Expanding coverage and improving quality: health reforms and policy learning across Europe.

Infectious diseases, vaccination access and emergency preparedness

Mandatory vaccination policies, vaccine hesitancy, scarce resources.
